## Key knowledge

#### Queen Elizabeth

- Queen Elizabeth II was a famous monarch.
- She was born in London in April 1926 and died in September 2022.
- She is famous for being the longest serving monarch in the United Kingdom for over 70 years.
- In 1952 she became Queen after her father, King George VI died.
- Significant events include the Coronation in 1953 and the Platinum Jubilee in 2022.

### King Charles

- King Charles III is the current reigning monarch.
- He is Queen Elizabeth's eldest son and he became King in 2022.
- The royal family have links to Leicester through celebratory visits (The Queen's Diamond Jubilee) and opening new places (Green Dragon Square).

jubilee	A special anniversary of an event.
