



Planet	A planet is a large, round object (celestial body) that
	travels around a star in space.
Earth	The planet that we live on.
Ocean	Large area of salt water
	Oceans are between the continents.
Land	Any part of the Earth's surface that is not covered in
	water.
Atmosphere	The layer of gases that are around the Earth. This includes
	the oxygen that we breathe.
Satellite	An object in space that circles around a larger object in
	Space.
	These can be natural like the moon or man-made
	(artificial) like the International Space Centre.
2D	A 2D object is flat. We can measure it's width (across it
2 Dimensional	from one side to the other) and it's height (from top to
	bottom).
3D	A 3D object is solid.
3 Dimensional	We can measure it's height (top to bottom), it's width
	(side to side) and it's depth (from front to back).
Continent	A very large area of land that is usually separated from
	other areas of land by water. There are 7 continents.
Countries	They are found within a continent. Each country has its
	own border that separates them from another country.
Мар	An image or picture of a place, usually, taken from above.
	Maps are flat and sometimes found in a book called an
