

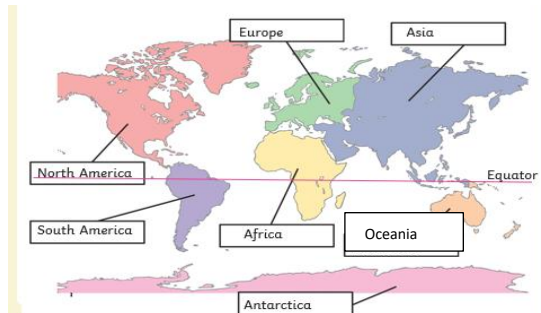

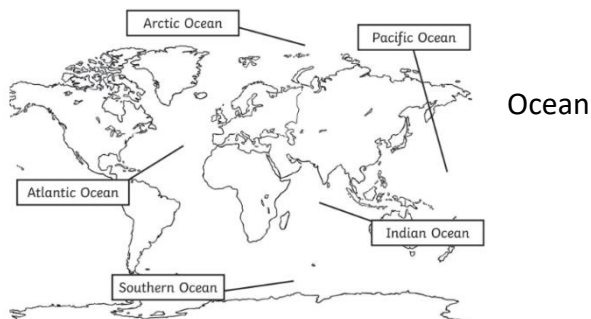

### Key Vocabulary and definitions

Vocabulary	Definition
<b>Planet</b>	A planet is a large, round object (celestial body) that travels around a star in space.
<b>Earth</b>	The planet that we live on.
<b>Ocean</b>	Large area of salt water Oceans are between the continents.
<b>Land</b>	Any part of the Earth's surface that is not covered in water.
<b>Atmosphere</b>	The layer of gases that are around the Earth. This includes the oxygen that we breathe.
<b>Satellite</b>	An object in space that circles around a larger object in Space. These can be natural like the moon or man-made (artificial) like the International Space Centre.
<b>2D</b> <b>2 Dimensional</b>	A 2D object is flat. We can measure it's width (across it from one side to the other) and it's height (from top to bottom).
<b>3D</b> <b>3 Dimensional</b>	A 3D object is solid. We can measure it's height (top to bottom), it's width (side to side) and it's depth (from front to back).
<b>Continent</b>	A very large area of land that is usually separated from other areas of land by water. There are 7 continents.
<b>Countries</b>	They are found within a continent. Each country has its own border that separates them from another country.
<b>Map</b>	An image or picture of a place, usually, taken from above. Maps are flat and sometimes found in a book called an
