	Definition
World	The earth and all the people and things upon it.
Countries	The land on earth is split into areas (countries). These are usually controlled by a government.
Compare	Looking at 2 or more things or places and noticing similarities and differences between them.
Similarities	A likeness or sameness between 2 or more things or places.
Differences	Not the same as or unlike a place or thing.
Daily routine	The regular things that someone does in a day – e.g what time they get up, eating breakfast, brushing their teeth, what time they eat meals, what time they go to bed.
Lives	The way that people live day to day.
