


Year 1 Art - Observational Drawing



What should I already know?

- We can draw a range of different lines.
- Drawings can be drawn by freehand.
- You can use different lines when you are drawing and painting.
- Famous artists use different lines in their work including Van Gogh, Rijneveld and Bridget Riley.



Key Vocabulary and Definitions

Vocabulary	Definition
artist	A person who creates art, drawings, paintings, sculptures
observational drawing	Drawing what you see in front of you
detail	Small parts of something bigger
'slow eyes'	Look at an object very carefully, moving your eyes slowly so that you can see the shapes, details and colours better than if you looked quickly at the object.
line	We make lines in art when we move the pencil, pen, chalk, crayon, oil pastel, charcoal on the paper or other material or object we are drawing on.
position	Where something is e.g. next to, in front of, behind, under, on top of
proportion	The size of objects compared to each other

Remember...

Use 'slow eyes' to really look carefully at the objects you are drawing. Draw what you can see, NOT what you remember.

Use different lines to show different shapes and textures.
