## Key Knowledge

- That children's lives in different countries can be compared. We can notice similarities and differences between lives.

	Definition
World	The earth and all the people and things upon it.
Countries	The land on earth is split into areas (countries). These are usually controlled by a government.
Compare	Looking at 2 or more things or places and noticing similarities and differences between them.
Similarities	A likeness or sameness between 2 or more things or places.
Differences	Not the same as or unlike a place or thing.
Daily routine	The regular things that someone does in a day – e.g. what time they get up, eating breakfast, brushing their teeth, what time they eat meals, what time they go to bed.
Lives	The way that people live day to day.
