



What should I already know?

Key Vocabulary and definitions

Pentatonic scale	A music scale that uses 5 notes, C, D, E, G and A.
Note	A musical symbol that shows a singer or musician which pitch to sing or play at.
Pitch	A high or low note.
Tempo	The speed that music is played.
Perform	To sing in front of an audience.
Sing	To make musical sounds with our voice.
Audience	To watch a performance or someone perform.
