- We must be kind to other people online.
- We shouldn't believe everything that we read online.
- We shouldn't read messages from people we don't know.
- We should take a break from **technology**.
- Lots of games can be played on the **internet**, such as Roblocks, Fortnite and Minecraft.
- iPads, Youtube and Google are **online**.
- **Technology** can be useful if we use it safely.
