

#### Our theme for Autumn 1 is:



This half term we will be diving into the wonderful world of books! We will be delving into traditional and modern tales. We will also explore Sikhism, focussing on special days in the religion. We will be learning about different materials and their properties. We will also be learning about the Great Fire of London.

Our theme will last for:

6 weeks and 3 days.

#### **Phonics**

We will continue with phonics throughout this half term. The children will continue to:

- Choose the correct graphemes to spell a word say the word, segment
  the word, write the word.
- Apply sounds to read *look at the letters, make the sounds, blend the sounds together.*
- Read and spell high frequency words correctly.

We will focus on the following sounds – u-e (y+oo), u-e (long oo), ew (y+oo), ew (long oo), er (ur), ir (ur), ou (ou), oy (oi), au (or), aw (aw), ou (oo), oul (oo), a (ar), al (ar).

## **English**




Our reading and writing will focus on securing our understanding of the rules of spelling and grammar. The children will:

- Ensure full stops and capital letters are used correctly.
- Understand how to use exclamation marks and questions marks.
- Identify the different forms of sentences and begin to use these in their writing (statements, questions, exclamations and commands)
- Use the conjunctions and, or, but, so, when, if, because to extend sentences when writing.
- Complete some extended writing to develop their stamina for writing, including; writing the story of Hansel and Gretel and writing a non-fiction double page spread about the Great Fire of London.

Children will take part in Guided Reading, Book Talk and individual reading sessions to further improve reading skills, specifically focussing on comprehension skills.

#### **Mathematics**

This half term we will be looking at money. Children will learn to recognise the coins and use them to make amounts. Children will also learn how to make the same amount in different ways. We will also be learning multiplication and division, using jottings,

#### P.S.H.E.

Through our weekly PSHE and RSHE sessions, we will be learning about:

- Identifying different feelings and tell others how we feel.
- Which school/classroom rules are about helping people to feel safe.
- Naming our own Early Warning Signs.
- How we know which adults and friends we can trust.
- Who we can talk with if we have a worry or need to ask for help.
- What we can do if a friend or someone in our families aren't kind to us,
- Identifying private body parts and saying 'no' to unwanted touch?
- What to do if we feel worried about a secret.

#### RE

During our R.E. lessons we will be learning about Sikhism. We will learn:

Why is the Guru Granth Sahib important to Sikhs?

- The Guru Granth Sahib as the revealed holy book for Sikhs— how it should be treated with respect.
- Used by Sikhs as a life guide, includes sotries and teachings (e.g. Guru Nanak and the boulder)

#### Music

This half term the children will learn about 20th century music. We will:

- Understand that a piece of music has a beginning, middle and end.
- Understand how the features of music can be used in the beginning, middle and end of a piece.
- Know that tuned instruments and voices can make different notes
- Know which notes work well together.

#### Geography

This half term the children will:

- Know the names of the world's seven continents.
- Understand the different sizes of continents.
- Understand that a continent is made up of countries.
- Name some countries within each continent.
- Know some geographical features of each continent. (desert, jungle, cities, rainforest)
- Know the names of the world's five oceans.
- Understand the difference between seas and oceans.

#### Art

We will be focussing on Drawing techniques, using line, shape, space, position, shading, hatching, cross hatching, smudging . We will:

- Know that shading can be used to create an effect when drawing.
- Know that different lines can be used to create an effect.
- Know that some materials are better for a desired effect.



#### <u>P.E.</u>

We will be learning gymnastic. We will:

- Know how to copy and remember actions to create a sequence.
- Know how to hold a shape when balancing, strong core.
- Know how to jump across and over apparatus, gymnast starting pose,
   use strong core and finish with gymnast pose.
- Know how to use the apparatus safely, land with soft/bent knees.

# History

We will be learning about the Great Fire of London this half term. We will be able to:

- Name significant event.
- Know significant dates.
- Know why it is a significant event
- Know the impact that these events caused.
- Use historical vocabulary linked to event
- Know a range of sources can be used to find out information.

### <u>Design and Technology</u>

We will be creating a structure. We will:

- Know that shapes and structures with wide, flat bases or legs are the most stable.
- Understand that the shape of a structure affects its strength.
- Know that materials can be manipulated to improve strength and
- Know that a structure is something which has been formed or made from parts.
