Learning Walks

This week I have visited all classes as part of our learning walk to observe teaching and learning in action. Craig Brown our School Improvement lead joined me on the learning walk and I am pleased to report that we observed consistent teaching of phonics across the school. I enjoyed seeing the recent training our Pre-School practitioners received a few weeks ago in action and the children learning to isolate initial sounds at the beginnings of words. Children in Reception were able to tell me what a digraph (two letters one sound) and a trigraph (three letters one sound) are. Our children in KS1 were confident in the lesson structure and knew exactly what they needed to do and demonstrated they could use and apply their phonics well. We are now looking at our next step in phonics and will be updating our action plan accordingly.
