Dear parents and carers,

I hope you had an enjoyable half term break, it has been wonderful to welcome the children back to school. There has been a very calm and settled feeling around school throughout the day. This half term we begin our Fantastic Festivals topic where the children will learn about different celebrations and events such as Diwali and Remembrance Day. This is one of my favourite topics and one where you will usually find classrooms and children covered in glitter as we create a range of artwork inspired by the different festivals.

We had a very productive training day on Monday, we looked at our three main priorities for school development this year:

Adjectives

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- Reasonable adjustments for children with additional needs We looked at different things we could use to support children's learning and focused in particular on how to use a communication tool called Widget. This is a tool that uses symbols to go alongside words to aid children's communication, understanding and learning. Over the next few weeks, you will hopefully see the use of symbols across the school and within the children's work.
- Enhancing the Reading culture We looked at the Reading Framework, this is a document created by the Department for Education (DfE) and we thought about how we can improve the reading culture across school. We looked at the importance of reading areas and staff had some time to make improvements to their reading areas.
- Enrichment opportunities for the children We created an 'Overdale Experience' of all the things we would like the children to experience during their time at Overdale Infant School this includes engaging in different sports activities, finding out about different careers, cooking, outdoor learning and visits to the local area. We will share more information about this shortly including ways you will be able to become involved and share your views on the suggested enrichment opportunities.

Next week we will have the first of our class assemblies, we are looking forward to parents being part of the assemblies and finding out about what the children have been learning. Class assemblies will start promptly at 9:20 and may last around 30 minutes.
