School Development Plan

Each year we create a school development plan that contains a range of areas for development. - Reasonable adjustments in the classroom We will be providing staff with further training in reasonable adjustments, exploring the use of technology and communication software to support this.
- Enhancing our enrichment opportunities We will be mapping out the activities that will widen the children's experiences and hopefully broaden their horizons.

The school will also continue to work on enhancing the curriculum, supporting our curriculum coordinators to lead their subjects effectively and continue to provide high quality coaching for all of our teachers to embed our teaching and learning strategies.
