


Year 1 Maths: Measurement - Time

Key Vocabulary and definitions

Time	To measure how long it takes for things to
rinte	, ,
	happen, how long-ago things happened in the
	past and when things may happen in the
	future. To measure what time in the day it is.
Clock	Shows time, indicates hours, minutes, and
	sometimes seconds, by hands on a clock face
	(or digital, like on a phone).
Hour	A length of time equal to 60 minutes.
Minute	A length of time equal to 60 seconds.
Clock hands	The hands (pointers) show the time on an
	analogue clock.
0'clock	Used to specify the hour when telling the time
	e.g., 5 o'clock.
Half past	Thirty minutes after an hour.
Day	There are 24 hours in a day.
Month	There are 12 months in a year: January,
	February, March, April, May, June, July,
	August, September, October, November,
	December.
Week	There are 7 days in a week: Monday,
	Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday,
	Saturday, Sunday.
Weekend	Saturday and Sunday.
